NANNY STILL SET OF 3 POMPADOUR GLASS VASES

These two glass vase designs are created by two talented women that worked at the prominent Finnish glass work company Riihimäen Lasi. The Riihimäki Glassworks began its operations on February 2nd, 1910. Mikko Adolf Kolehmainen and Aatu Paavo Kolehmainen together with Hjalmar Gabriel Paloheimo, Karl Alfred Paloheimo and Wäinö Bonsdorff founded a limited company with a purpose to build a glass factory in Riihimäki. From the 1920s onward, Riihimäki Glassworks started to pay more attention to the design side of glass production. Nanny Still's gorgeous pair of clear vintage Pompadour vases were designed at the Riihimäen Lasi glassworks in the 1960s. Award-winning Nanny Still was only Riihimäen Lasi's second woman designer, later becoming one of the leading designers for Finland's largest glassworks for almost 30 years. Still studied at Finland's Central School of Arts and Crafts and graduated in 1950. She mainly designed decorative glass bottles, vases, goblets and jars, with beautiful colors and elegant shapes. Her glass pieces have become true collector's items and are often sold at auctions.
